OFFICERS- #231 Lt. Bensel reported requesting replacement of box lights with LEDs, 12 for now. Sunday station going to Penndell F.D. to look at their new ladder.

FIRE POLICE- Meeting at station 172 on March 23rd. Class for new fire police at Hainesport F.D on May 22nd.

A motion was made by Commissioner Turcich and seconded by Commissioner Quaciari to pay all bills present. The Board was polled. All AYES. The motion was carried.

E.V.T- Changing lights on 2317 to red and blue, 2318 needs seat belt replaced, 2328 is at Donovans, 2317 air bag warning light is on, 2321 needs side inlet rebuilt.

GRANT- We are currently working on the Safer Grant.

NEW BUSINESS- None.

OLD BUSINESS- Working on gov deals.

Delran Fire Department Department Chiefs Report

March 8, 2022

Currently we are at 107 calls for the year: 25 calls since the last meeting.

2/28 - 102 Spruce Street for a report of a house fire. Was deemed a issue with the HVAC system was turned back over to the landlord.

2/25 - Haines Mill and Conrow for an MVC. Crews provided manpower and traffic control for the incident.

2/26 – Station 231 dispatched to assist with lighting for a water recovery. They were recalled enroute.

3/2 – Department was dispatched for an MVC at Chestnut Street and 3rd Street. Upon arrival the assignment was upgraded to a Rescue Assignment and R2329 went into service with the tools. Patient was extricated in under 10 minutes and placed into EMS care. Crews stood by for the tow and clean-up of the scene.

3/3 – Department was dispatched for a brush fire behind 3011 Bridgeboro Road by police. B2316 located a 30x5 fire and was able to contain and extinguish the same.

Official congrats to the two reelected commissioners and also for the passing of the budget.

Department completed the Sexual Harassment training last night. The drill was recorded and will be made available for those that did not take make the drill last night.

My meeting with Jeff Gordon from ISO will be on the 16th of this month.
