

**DELRAN BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS
CAUCUS MEETING
JULY 12, 2022**

The meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Delran Township Fire District #1 was held on Tuesday evening, July 12, 2022 at the fire district office.

President Joseph Parento, commencing with the flag salute called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

The President announced that this meeting is being conducted within the provisions of N.J.S. 10-4.6 to N.J.S. 10:4-41 titled Open Public Meetings and that the time and place has been posted on the bulletin board of the Municipal Building, and was advertised in the Burlington County Times on February 19, 2022.

Other members of the Board of Fire Commissioners and appointed persons present were Commissioners; James Bauer, Anthony Quaciari, and James Turcich. Also, Officers present were: Chief Peak, Deputy Chief Joseph Cunningham Sr., Battalion Chief #231 Scott Seybert, #231 Lt. Lutz, and #232 Lt. Dugme.

COMMUNICATIONS- All communications that have been received by the Clerk were distributed.

CHIEF- Chief Peak submitted his written report. He also reported that he has been planning for Delran Night Out scheduled August 2.

DEPUTY CHIEF: Deputy Chief Cunningham reported that Ten (10) 360 Helmets were ordered.

BATTALION CHIEF #231: No report.

CAPTAIN: Captain Cunningham reported that he is setting up a Coast Guard Auxiliary Boating Safety Course. The seats in Marine 23 are being reupholstered. CEVO 4 Instructors have been upgraded.

LEIUTENANTS: Lt. Lutz asked if the fire department is still using the small black CO detectors. If so, Station 1 needs to replace theirs. Further discussion to follow.

E.V.T. – Commissioner Parento reported that #2316 needs short flat shovels.

BUILDING & GROUNDS- Wiring inspection for Station #231 will be July 15. A water fountain will be installed at the firehouse.

BILLS FOR PAYMENT- Commissioner Quaciari made a motion, which was seconded by Commissioner Turcich for the Treasurer to pay all bills present. The Board was polled. All AYES. The motion was carried.

FIRE OFFICIAL: Walt Bauer reported that the LEA is scheduled to go back and perform the “home” inspections again before Covid-19. Our open house at the stations will be a week after the school homecoming.

Delran Fire Department Department Chiefs Report

July 12, 2022

Currently we are at 327 calls for the year.

6/30 – Station 231 was dispatched and responded with E2312 and myself to Willingboro for a dwelling fire. Once on location we were staged in manpower and then released.

7/2 – Station 232 myself and Engine 2321 responded to District 16 with a crew of 6 for a cover assignment while they operated on a structure fire in their local. Crews remained on cover for about 45 minutes.

7/3 – Department responded on a MVC at Hartford and Route 130 for a single vehicle MVC into the median. Crews cleared the roadway and debris.

7/4 – Department responded to the area of Advanced auto for another MVC into a pole with wires hanging low. Scene was later turned over to DOT and PD.

7/4 – Department was dispatched to the Dredge Marina for assistance with helping a injured person on to the dock for medical care.

7/12 – TF 23 fire police were requested into the state forest again to assist with a WUI assignment.

Department took part in the parade this past 4th of July in Riverton.

Spoke with Greg Boehmke in regards to the website for the department and we are getting dates from Nate and will choose a good date and set it up with him and anyone from the department that will wish to attend.

The past week I have been focused on updating the County Resources of our engines, brush unit, water resources, marina units, and capabilities of the department. The county was very out of date with our engines and other resources.

Took a few moments and went over different options and “pre plans” of the proposed car wash that will be moving and taking place of the gas station on Tenby and Route 130NB.
